

RESOLUTION NO. 453

**AMENDS RESOLUTION #396 BY AUTHORIZING AN
INCREASE IN THE DISTRICT'S PLANT INVESTMENT FEE.**

WHEREAS, the East Wenatchee Water District adopted the above resolution on December 14, 1992, authorizing a Plant Investment Fee on the sale of all water meters, and

WHEREAS, the Washington State Legislature passed substitute Senate Bill #6013 effective July 23, 1989, whereby a Water or Sewer District is entitled to charge for a customer to connect to that system, and

WHEREAS, the Connection Charge shall be the pro-rata share of the cost of the existing facilities and planned future improvements for the next ten years and other directly attributable costs borne by the District (but, those costs shall not include portions of the system which have been contributed to the district), and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners instructed the Manager to have the District's Engineer update the District's Plant Investment Fee charges based on standard engineering practice, and


WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has reviewed the updated PLANT Investment Fee calculation and agrees that it should be increased according to ATTACHMENT A, and

NOW THEREFOR, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the East Wenatchee Water District, having reviewed the updated Plant Investment Fee calculations, and concurring with the Manager and the District Engineer's recommendation, hereby adopt the increased Plant Investment Fee's as detailed in EXHIBIT A. Provided the Board of Commissioners will allow customers to purchase meters at the current Plant Investment Fee if the customer has made arrangements to purchase said meter(s) prior to the implementation of the new fee and the meter must be activated within one year or the fees will be refunded and the current fee structure will preside. The Board of Commissioners authorizes the Manager to use good engineering judgment in determining which Plant Investment Fee and Meter Fee is charged for meters larger than one and one-half inches

VII. SCHEDULE OF CONNECTION CHARGES

1. Residential Connections (5/8"x3/4" and 1" meters)

NOTES:
 (1) Single family connections where 1" meters are required shall be considered the same as two multifamily dwelling units.
 (2) The P.I.F. Charge for multi-family service connections with greater than (4) dwellings shall be based on meter size as shown in Table B.
 (3) The P.I.F. for each additional multi-family unit shall be computed at 80% of the base charge up to a total of 4 dwellings.

2. 1.5" and Larger Meter Connections

 (1) Meter capacity based on AWWA standard for maximum rated continuous capacity for compound meters.
 (2) Flow factor calculated based on a maximum rated continuous capacity for a 5/8"x3/4" meter of 20 gallons per minute.
