## RESOLUTION NO. 261

## MANDATORY TO INSTALL STEEL PIPE FROM WATER METER TO DWELLING

WHEREAS, after considerable research has been spent to determine various policies of other towns and cities on types of piping used from the water meter to the dwelling, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that few or no problems did exist where steel pipe was used, and

WHEREAS, the District having experienced an unusual cold winter with numberous frozen lines and broken water meters, causing an inconvenience and hardship to the customers of the District, and

WHEREAS, the problems could be corrected where steel pipe existed by being able to apply heat to thaw said lines, and

WHEREAS, plastic or PVC pipe made it virtually impossible to restore water to those customers that experienced frozen pipes, thereby causing a hardship and an inconvenience to said customers, and

WHEREAS, the District desires to accommodate all customers whenever possible and believes it would be deemed in the best interest to the District and to its future customers to make it mandatory to have steel pipe installed from the meter to the existing dwelling.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the EAST WENATCHEE WATER DISTRICT, BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS will make it a mandatory policy that steel pipe be installed on the property side of the meter to all applicants who purchase a water meter from this day forward.

ADOPTED, this 5th day of February, 1979, by the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the EAST WENATCHEE WATER DISTRICT, Douglas County, Washington, at a regular meeting thereof.
