

RESOLUTION NO. 634

EMERGENCY RESOLUTION FOR MAIN REPLACEMENT ON FAIRVIEW PLACE

WHEREAS, the East Wenatchee Water District has attempted to make repairs to the existing 2 inch old galvanized main, and

WHEREAS, the crew continued to try to repair the main and the galvanized wall continued to break away and cause more leaks, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the best interest of the District to declare this project as an Emergency and proceed to procure 8" ductile iron pipe materials and associated parts and replace the existing pipe, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the District to use its own crew to replace said waterline, and


WHEREAS, there is a public safety issue if the main continued to leak, there is a possibility of additional road damage, and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the EAST WENATCHEE WATER DISTRICT that the watermain replacement project on Fairview Place be deemed as an Emergency.

ADOPTED, this 2nd day of May, 2012, by the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the East Wenatchee Water District, Douglas County, Washington at a regular meeting thereof.

NOTE TO THE FILE-EMERGENCY LEAK FAIRVIEW PL.


On April 25th 2012 our crews went to repair a leak in the 2" mainline on Fairview Place. In the process of repairing the 1st leak, the crew chased and repaired three additional leaks. I was called to the job site to see what could be done to make a more permanent fix to prevent more leaks. We have repaired leaks in that main in the past and due to the condition it is in, I decided it needs to be replaced. I instructed the crew not to backfill the holes they have dug for fear it would further damage the pipe.

I then went to the office to talk to Greg and Vince about the situation. I told them the condition of the pipe and that most of it is behind the sidewalk under driveways and mature landscaping. The main was installed in a common trench with PUD power, communication lines and an irrigation line making it very difficult to repair. We decided the potential for future leaks and property damage was very high and the main needs to be replaced. This replacement needs to be expedited. Greg instructed me to start the groundwork for the project and he would work on an emergency resolution and discuss it with the District's attorney and commissioners.

My work included:

- Meet with the City of East Wenatchee to inform them of the project and coordinate a road closure
- Call the Utility Notification Center to have other underground utilities located
- Talk with the Church of Latter-Day Saints to schedule a water outage
- Assemble a material list and procure materials
- Notify property owners of the upcoming project
- Notify emergency services (fire, police, ect.) and the Eastmont School District of the upcoming road closure
- Coordinate with asphalt company to restore road surface during road closure
